



# Script: “It’s Cool”

**Teacher:** Oh, classsss!

**Students:** Oh, yesssss!

**Teacher:** Hands and Eyes! (Spread arms out wide, then bring them together and fold hands.)

**Students:** (Imitating gesture.) Hands and Eyes!

**Teacher:** Great! You did that so well, I’m going to give you a Smiley! (Walk to board, get a marker.) Hold it! Hold it! (Make a mark on the Smiley side of the Scoreboard. Then, whirl and point to class.)

**Teacher:** Everyone will make mistakes. It’s okay, no big deal. The worst thing that will happen to you if you make a mistake is that everyone will tell you, “It’s cool.” For example, Dwayne...what year was the French Revolution?

**Dwayne:** 1920?

**Teacher:** No, it was 1789. Tell Dwayne, “It’s cool!”

**Students:** It’s cool!

**Teacher:** Gage, what is the capital of Idaho?

**Gage:** I don’t know.

**Teacher:** It’s Boise. Tell Gage, “It’s cool!”

**Students:** It’s cool!
